NEW Mini Bus for Kennel Lane School, Bracknell



In 2006 three local organizations joined forces to collect funds in support of Kennel Lane School, Bracknell. CWSN Foundation, Mill Ride Golf Club and the Rotary Club of Ascot all raised over £30,000 during the year to purchase a desperately needed, specially adapted accessible mini bus.

This bus is an invaluable asset to Kennel Lane School, enabling them to access the full curriculum, travel to other special schools and take part in sporting tournaments.

All three organizations were determined to support Kennel Lane's ambition to enable disabled children, including children in wheelchairs, to socialise, work and play with their able-bodied friends and school mates.

Deputy Head Teacher Jan Beats said "now our children can enjoy the same outdoor events and day trips as their more able bodied school friends. It will help us hugely in allowing our children to achieve their full potential"

The children could not wait to explore and use the bus including some in their wheelchairs being lifted in by the hydraulic ramps.
